

Update on your Alumni Association

Below are the current objectives for our Association along with updates on our progress.

Objective 1: Hold Alumni Events

1(a) Hold Quarterly $K\Sigma$ Happy Hour Gatherings - The quarterly $K\Sigma$ happy hour gatherings have been very successful. Attendance is commonly over 30 including spouses and guests. Recently,



several undergraduate brothers from our ΛE Chapter have been joining us. The next gathering will be at the chapter house on November 8 as discussed earlier in the newsletter. 1(b) Hold Annual Founders Day Celebrations - Past tradition was for the $K\Sigma AACF$ to organize an annual dinner celebrating the founding of Kappa Sigma Fraternity (Founders Day) with the undergraduate brothers of our ΛE Chapter organizing ۵ chapter anniversary dinner. We have recently discussions been in with the undergraduate brothers about reestablishing this tradition.

1(c) Hold Annual Chapter Anniversary Celebrations - Beginning in 2009, the $K\Sigma AACF$ has organized an annual alumni undergraduate brother golf outing to celebrate the founding of our ΛE Chapter. The 4th annual anniversary golf outing, held this year on April 21, was a highly successful event.

40th ΛE Chapter's The anniversary celebration dinner was re-scheduled to coincide with the chapter (re-chartering) installation banquet on February 26, 2011. The initial chartering of our ΛE Chapter on April 30, 1971 was honored as part of the installation banquet ceremonies along with the awarding of a second charter after a highly successful and very short colony period.



The ceremonies also included the presentation of the Kappa Sigma Golden Heart Award by Brother WGM Bill Betz three of our ΛE Chapter to undergraduate brothers. who demonstrated extreme bravery in saving a injured individual's life after an auto accident on their way back from the $K\Sigma$ Eastern Regional Leadership Conference held in New Orleans in July 2010.

2(c) Keep the KSAACF Web Site Current - Brother Richard Patch is not only an excellent Treasurer for your



Association but he also is an accomplished webmaster. Richard is keeping your web site current by posting upcoming $K\Sigma AACF$ events on our calendar, posting photos from past events, and providing timely announcements.

2(d) Maintain a Close Working Relationship with the ΛE Chapter's Alumni Relations Chair - Your Association EC has and will continue to work closely with the Alumni Relations Chair for our ΛE Chapter to plan future events and foster a close relationship between the undergraduate and alumni $K\Sigma$ brothers.

2(e) Establish a Chapter Historian - As many of you know, Brother Mike Miller has informally served as the ΛE Chapter Historian for well over a decade. Well it is time to formalize his role. Not only has Brother Miller accepted this assignment, he also now serves as the Faculty Advisor for the ΛE Chapter. Mike will be presenting a short history of the ΛE Chapter to the Fall Pledge Class on Sunday, October 7 at 11 a.m. at the House. All Chapter brothers are encouraged to attend. Mike intends to give similar presentations to future pledge classes each fall and winter semesters. We are planning to video record Mike's presentations this spring and posting it on the $K\Sigma AACF$ website to enable all $K\Sigma$ brothers to view his informative presentation on our chapter's history.

Objective 3: <u>A Greater Cause</u>: Support Charitable Causes

3(a) Establish a "Brothers in Need Fund" – In 2009, your $K\Sigma AACF$

established the "Brothers in Need Fund" to assist $K\Sigma$ brothers in need of a helping hand. To date, over \$1,800 has been raised, \$1,000 of which is from Brother Lee Constantine's Charity Challenge. Over \$800 of the funds raised to-date have and are continuing to be used to provide much needed personal care items for Charter Brother Richard "Jeff" Junkins, who suffered a stroke while living in Costa Rica in 2000. Brother Junkins now relies on public assistance for his care at an extended care home in Orlando. The remaining funds are being in held in reserve to assist other brothers who may need a helping hand in the future. 3(b) Support Undergraduate Charitable Causes - Your $K\Sigma AACF$ continues to provide financial support for charitable fund raising efforts by the ΛE Chapter. For example, the undergraduate brothers have raised over \$3,000 to-date on behalf of the <u>Brian Dornbusch Memorial</u> <u>Scholarship Fund</u>.



As many of you know, our late ΛE Chapter Alumni Advisor, Brother Dornbusch was only 33 years old when he passed away



after developing a blood clot during cancer treatment. He was very involved with $K\Sigma$ and the ΛE Chapter. In memory of Brother Dornbusch, an endowed scholarship was created through the UCF Foundation. Your Association was a Platinum \$500 Sponsor for Brian Dornbusch Memorial 5k Run and Walk held by the ΛE Chapter.

3(c) Make it Easy to Make Donations to Charitable Causes Supported by the Association - Making a donation to the "Brothers in Need Fund" or to the Brian Dornbusch Memorial Scholarship Fund just got easier! You can a make donation on-line at any time using Paypal by going to <u>http://www.ksaacf.org/dues.html</u>. You also can set up a recurring payment of \$5 or more per month via Paypal. Part of your monthly payments each year will cover your \$35 annual Association dues with the remaining funds contributed to the charitable cause that you designate.

Objective 4. <u>Brothers in Action</u>: Support Brotherhood Development

Your $K\Sigma AACF$ has for over a decade sponsored an undergraduate brother from the ΛE Chapter to attend $K\Sigma$ Conclaves and Leadership Conferences. The alumni association has paid for hotel and registration expenses. On occasion, the Chapter has elected to use the funds for gasoline so that more brothers can attend and participate in the brotherhood development opportunity.

Objective 5. <u>Champion Quest</u>: Increase membership

Membership in our Association has held fairly steady peaking most recently during the re-chartering of the ΛE Chapter in 2010. The Association needs your support in order to maintain an active alumni chapter status with $K\Sigma$ and to achieve Association's objectives. Annual our alumni dues remain low, only \$35 a year. There are three methods of payment: (1) mail in a check, (2) charge or pay using echeck via PayPal, or (3) pay Brother Patch directly at one of our guarterly happy hour gatherings or at other events. Around The World (ATW) was started in October 1999 by a small group of ΛE brothers that were working up in Philadelphia. Missing Florida, the "Philly" crew each managed to find new jobs in Sarasota. Brother Alan Rosa suggested they take-in a weekend at Epcot, and while the ten brothers walked "Around The World" they enjoying cold refreshments as a way of celebrating their return to Florida.





This informal gathering, which is not affiliated with the $K\Sigma$ Fraternity or the $K\Sigma AACF$ (even though 90% of the attendees are from the ΛE Chapter), has become a highly enjoyable tradition. The annual event is scheduled each year to coincide with the Food and Wine Festival at Epcot, and when UCF is not playing a home football game. Participation has consistently grown ranging from the initial 10 to 55 participants in 2011. ATW weekend includes a golf outing on Friday morning and an informal dinner that evening. Friends, family, and brothers that may not be able to participate in Saturday's event at Epcot are invited to join everyone for golf and/or dinner on Friday. This year ATW will begin the day after the alumni-undergraduate brother "Meet and Greet" at the ΛE Chapter House on November 8:
